

4. From the list What type of appointment would you like to schedule select "Tutoring"




5. From the list To help you find a time, please tell us why you'd like to see someone select "Student Success Center".

Scholarship Programs



Presidential Campus Enrichment Grants

Eligibility: Incoming first-year students

Award: \$2,500 per semester for 8 semesters (Architecture, 10 semesters)

GPA Requirement: 3.0 / Credits: 30 per academic year

Number of students: Over 150

Other requirements: Participate in activities that relate to diversity, inclusion, or social justice (e.g., activism on a college campus, difficult conversations, religion and diversity)



Presidential Scholarship Initiatives

Eligibility: Competitive scholarship program that targets and rewards academically talented students who have shown a persistence and commitment to academic excellence.

Award: PSI is a renewable 4-year (or 8 semesters) scholarship that will cover regular charges related to: tuition, fees, and room and board costs. *Architecture and Landscape Architecture majors - 5 years (or 10 semesters)

GPA Requirement: 3.0 / Credits: 30 per academic year

Number of students: Over 320

Other requirements: Participate in 6 enrichments and 2 reflection papers per year

Ujima Living Learning Program

Ujima is an essential concept in African philosophy and is also the third principle of Kwanzaa. It means collective work and responsibility.

• Take Introduction to African American Studies (AFST 1714) with other students in Ujima.

Ujima has five core pillars guiding your experience

- Academic Support and Mentoring
- Cultural Identity Development
- Leadership Development
- Service
- Healthy Social Engagement



- **Myth**: Tutoring or coaching are only for students in serious academic trouble.
 - > Fact: While we do help those students, we also provide holistic resources to help anyone better meet their goals, even high-achieving students.
- **Myth**: Students can easily find a tutoring or coaching appointment.
 - ➤ **Fact**: These services are in high demand, so we encourage booking appointments well in advance, especially during exam times. Students can make up to three appointments in a two-week window.
- ❖ Myth: The SSC is so great! They provide tutoring for all courses.
 - ➤ **Fact**: We maximize our support by prioritizing the highest-demand undergraduate courses with the largest enrollment.



- ❖ Myth: I would like the SSC to proctor my test.
 - > Fact: Unfortunately, we no longer provide this service.
- **♦ Myth**: All SSC coaching is done by students.
 - > Fact: Our staff also does coaching for students with more significant academic need.
- ❖ Myth: My advisor isn't available, so I'll just get help from a coach instead.
 - ➤ **Fact**: Our coaches cannot replace the specialized work of academic advisors; they are trained on completely different skills, and we would never recommend this!



- ❖ Myth: UNIV 1004 is so easy--I'm going to get an A no matter what!
 - > Fact: While designed to support student success, this is a course like any other that requires regular attendance and assignments to succeed.
- ❖ Myth: My student would love to join Ujima, but they're not black.
 - > Fact: Actually, Ujima supports all students who wish to learn more about the African Diaspora, regardless of their background.

- Myth: Going to tutoring once the day before my test will be enough.
 - ➤ Fact: The individualized nature of our support can take time and reinforcement for students to see the most benefit; it is very challenging to cover a semester's worth of material in an hour or two. (Also, appointments should be booked in advance!)
- ❖ Myth: I'm going in for general tutoring--not for any particular course.
 - ➤ **Fact**: We would suggest coaching for support in generalized skills related to studying, test-taking, note-taking, time management, and more; our tutors only support specific courses.
- ❖ Myth: My tutor can just explain what I don't know, so I won't have to study.
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
